

Dr. Andrew Horowitz Awarded Prestigious Fellowship from American College of Surgeons

One of only two fellowships awarded to oral and maxillofacial surgeons across entire Westchester County, New York

Scarsdale, New York - October 6, 2013 – Andrew Horowitz, DMD, MD, was today initiated as a Fellow by The American College of Surgeons (ACS) during the 2013 American College of Surgeons Clinical Congress held in Washington D.C. Dr. Horowitz, a partner in the Scarsdale, NY office of New York Oral, Maxillofacial, and Implant Surgery (NYOMIS) has the distinct honor of being one of only two oral and maxillofacial surgeons initiated as a Fellow from Westchester County.

The FACS designation means that the surgeon's education and training, professional qualifications, surgical competence, and ethical conduct have passed a rigorous evaluation, and have been found to be consistent with the high standards established and demanded by the College.

Dr. Horowitz is one of the few Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons in the area that has earned both a dental and medical degree. He has special training in implantology, maxillofacial pathology, bone grafting, reconstructive, and facial cosmetic surgery. Dr. Horowitz earned his Doctorate of Dental Medicine from The University of Pennsylvania, in addition to his medical degree earned from The Mount Sinai School of Medicine where he also completed a General Surgery internship. He went on to complete his residency training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at The Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City. He is a former faculty member at The Columbia University Medical Center and currently on staff at White Plains Hospital Center in White Plains, New York. Dr. Horowitz resides in Chappaqua, New York with his wife and two children.
